HOW YOU CAN STUDY AT VSP

ELIGIBILITY

- Students must be at least 18 years of age at the start of the program to be eligible to apply, unless otherwise stated for the course package
- Students must be enrolled as an undergraduate student at their home institution
- For some courses, pre-requisites or a preferred background may apply
- Students must be proficient in English and have a strong academic background
