

Value Education for First Year Students

NSS REPORT

Like every year, the NSS unit started with gusto undertaking various projects and rendering social service to society. The year started with an orientation programme for first year NSS students where in area coordinator, Mr. R P Paul, was invited to interact with the students and highlight the benefits of being a part of the NSS Unit. The students had an orientation programme on 24th July at ADAPT-Spastic Society, the NGO adopted to render community service. The students helped the disabled children in writing, story-reading, speaking, playing, drawing activities, and also helped teachers to teach yoga and interpretation of notes. This year our students performed a skit for the children at ADAPT on respect to elders, trust and friendship.

On 9th August, our student volunteers participated in the peace rally held at Mani Bhavan. Students celebrated Independence Day with great enthusiasm in college. Some volunteers also participated in the university Independence Day programme. The Mount Mary Fair from 8th to 15th September was yet another important event for the Unit. Our students provided security at the fair and spread awareness about Dengue, Malaria and Diabetes amongst the pilgrims. They were also stationed at the health booth, and assisted the doctors in providing first-aid. The students also participated in the Bhajan Sandhya organised by the university to commemorate the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi. 40 students participated in the Hepatitis Rally organised by United Way. 40 students also participated in the Cancer Awareness Rally organised by the D H Research Center. 29 students participated in a rally organised by United Way on "Awareness about Diabetes". Students also made paper bags and note books and distributed it amongst the shopkeepers and needy students. This year the Unit undertook the "Road Safety Project" to spread awareness among the public about the various measures pertaining to road safety.

Various sessions to create awareness amongst our students were also organised by the unit. Students had sessions on First Aid, Disaster Management, Hepatitis B, Cancer amongst Women, Performing a Street Play, Dengue and Malaria Awareness, and The Importance of Voting. Owing to the upcoming elections, the unit was entrusted to execute the Voter's Registration Drive in college in alliance with AGNI- a NGO.

In collaboration with Yuvak Biradari, students participated in various activities such as Mock Parliament, Ek Sur Ek Tal, National Integration Programme, Personality Development, Leadership Skill Programme etc. The students also donated old text books, stationery products and books amongst needy children. The students participated in the "Share and Care programme" wherein volunteers went to various housing societies to inquire and spread awareness about the maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness in the society. Our Unit was awarded the "Best College Award" for the year 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 for being the most active college for two consecutive years. Students also participated in various camps. Two first year students participated in the Leadership Training Programme. One student was a part of the organizing committee of the same Leadership Training Camp, and one student participated in the "AVHAN Camp", the State-level Disaster management preparedness programme, and six students participated in the Yuvak Biradari Mock Parliament Camp.

The Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi Seva Trust and Holy Family Hospital was organised on 17th December 2013. Like last year we received an overwhelming

response from our students, and 272 units of blood were collected. Mahatma Gandhi Seva Trust felicitated the college for getting the highest number of blood donors for the year 2012-13.

The seven- day Rural Camp was yet another thrilling event for the volunteers. The camp was conducted at Sane Guruji Rashtra Smarak, Mangoan, Raigad from 6th January- 12th January 2014. 47 students with three professors attended the camp. Various guest lectures on Superstition, Sky Watching, Training on Disaster Management, Mock Drill, First Aid and Personality Development were held at the camp. Various documentaries and films on different issues such as Sexual Harassment, Investment Planning, War, and Racism etc were also screened at the camp. Street plays on topics such as superstition, female foeticide, child marriage, corruption and drug addiction were performed by our students at the nearby villages. Students had some other exhilarating activities such as treks, swimming sessions, treasure hunts, talent hunts, camp- fires etc. They also rendered community service at the camp.

This was yet another rewarding year for the NSS Unit, and our volunteers worked hard to serve the society and deliver social service with enthusiasm, fervor and with a sense of responsibility. They truly understand and accomplish the NSS motto “NOT ME, BUT YOU”.

Social Outreach Programme

The Social Outreach Programme for SYBA students successfully completed its eighth year. The objective of this Programme is to enlighten students about what the scripture tells us: “Whatsoever you do to the least of my people, you do it unto me” (Mathew 25:40). Through this quote, we remind students about Christ's concern for the poor and the marginalized, because we want them to respect what they have and share their surplus resources with the poor.

The Social Outreach Programme, made students aware of the need to empathize with the sufferings of the poor and the marginalized through 20 hours of service.

The Orientation Programme was conducted in July in the Conference Room. Students were asked to choose various centres through which they could complete their Outreach Programme. These centres were provided by the Institute for Community Organization Research (ICOR) with the help of Fr. Allwyn D'Silva and Deepika Singh who co-ordinated with the various centres. Prof. Kevin Miranda also co-ordinated with the students and the ICOR in allocating the centres. The various centres selected were Shelter Don Bosco, Auxilium Convent, Karuna Sadan, Cheshire Home, St. Anthony's Old Age Home, Sanjeevan Kendra, Shanti Daan, Sneha Sadan, Paryavaran Saurakshan Kendra, House of Charity, BUILD, ICOR, UMED, IDOBRO, Asha Kiran Community Centre, Navejeet Community Centre.

This year, five students were given scholarships on Annual day for the Social Outreach Programme. These scholarships were:

1. Rev. Fr. Nereus Rodrigues Scholarship for students in the Social Outreach Programme who are deserving - Rs. 10,000 was shared by Zenia Fernandes, Michelle Noronha and Zirzinia Sequeira.
2. Mrs. Marie Rodrigues Scholarship for a student in the Social Outreach Programme who is good in either Mathematics, Accounts or Science Rs. 5,000 was given to Milton Lobo.
3. Mr. Ivan Rodrigues Scholarship for a student in the Social Outreach Programme who is good hockey or any other sport - Rs. 5,000 was given to Leanne Barnes

SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME - Self Finance Courses

St. Andrew's College, as part of its Value education programme, allots NGOs to our second year students, where they have to contribute their services for 20 hours. This programme is conducted in coordination with SOSVA (Society for Service to Voluntary Agencies) which is situated at Bandra. This year our students worked with NGOs such as UCDC, Sparsh, Childhelp, Bal Jeevan, Kalyandeeep, Navjeet, YMCA, Sneha Sagar, Ashray, SOSVA and St. Andrew's league.

All students from S.Y.B.M.S. (120 students), S.Y.B.B.I. (60 students), S.Y.B.A.F. (60 students), S.Y.B.M.M. (60 students) & S.Y.B.Sc.I.T.(60 students) were part of the programme. They were divided into 60 groups, 5 students in each group. The remaining students carried out social service activities in their own parishes, under the supervision of their parish priest.

The students are given an opportunity to meet the darker side of life through these visits to the poor and the underprivileged. They team up with the NGOs to teach the children and also conduct many cultural activities for them. Our students also help NGOs in donation drives and other help to the NGOs. Some students assist the women who work in canteens. This programme allows our students to be moulded into good and responsible future citizens of our country.

ANDREAN COUNSELING UNIT

The Counseling Unit began in the academic year 2013-2014. A college counselor Ms Melanie Mathias was appointed, who was available for all six days of the week; from Monday to Saturday from 9:30am to 12:30pm.



The Counseling Unit began the academic year, by first sensitizing students to 'Understanding What is Counseling?' This was done through an orientation session from class-to-class, to help students understand the various aspects that the St Andrew's Counseling Unit could help them out in.

This unit has offered its services to about 61 individuals (students and adults); 37 individuals availed of counseling services and with more than 110+ follow-up session collectively and 24 students availed of testing services with about 60+ tests administered.

The various issues experienced by students and adolescents were – low self-esteem and confidence, academic issues, self-pity, behavioural issues, body image issues, domestic violence, bullying, discord in interpersonal relationship, incompetence, self destruction, depression, fear, unable to manage time,

career confusion, negative thoughts, relationship issues, aggression and impulsive behaviour, inability to handle difficult emotions, substance abuse, and so on.

These issues were dealt using counseling techniques like anger management, reality therapy, test administration, cognitive behaviour therapy, client-centered therapy, Gestalt's empty chair technique, challenging thoughts, assertiveness training, organizational skills – Time management, positive thinking, solution focused brief therapy, relaxation techniques and in group conflict situations, group counseling.

St Andrew's College Counseling Unit has been reaching out to students in need of any help, be it academics, developmental or social; which means, providing assistance in area of need by "enriching life and making a difference" and in order to assist them to achieve personal and social growth and development.

ANNEXURE-6

Gender Development Cell

The year started with a workshop for TYBA students by Mr Joe Rodrigues on women empowerment. Besides talks and discussions related to women empowerment, he also conducted a class on self defence.

ANNEXURE-10

The Nature Club (Department of Environmental Studies)

The Nature Club got off to a flying start with a three-day nature festival, 'PRAKRUTI 4' organised by Bhavan's Nature and Adventure centre on 10th, 11th and 12th January, 2014. Four of our students from F.Y.B.Com. & F.Y.B.A participated in the Painting/Drawing competition where Ms. Sheetal Kotian (F.Y.B.COM.) secured the second place.

On 11th February, 2014, Mr. Vivek Sundara, Convener- Justice and Peace for All (JAPA), screened three documentaries for the first year degree college students on the following topics - Nuclear Radiation at Kalpakkam in Tamil Nadu, Mercury Poisoning in Kodaikanal, and Atomic Waste Disposal of Tarapur Atomic Centre in Maharashtra. Students of F.Y.B.Com and F.Y.B.A were made aware of the harmful effects of nuclear radiation of the plant at Kalapakkam, particularly the increase of various diseases such as cancer and other disabilities. The factory at Kodaikanal has been disposing poisonous mercury waste thereby polluting the environment. Protests from local residents against this nuisance forced the government to bring down the shutters of the factory. Fish have disappeared from Mumbai coast due to the discharge of hot water from the Tarapur Atomic Reactor thus adversely affecting the livelihood of the local fisher folk.

The guest speakers interacted with students on the various health and environmental problems related to the development projects in our country. Handouts on environmental degradation caused by the Jaitapur Nuclear Power Project (Ratnagiri) were also distributed to the students.
