

Retest (Additional Internal Examination) Eligibility and Procedure

Conditions:

- (1) Absent for some / all course tests on
 - a. Medical grounds
 - b. Representing college or university for sports/cultural/NSS/NCC activities / camps
- (2) Submit application to the college office (addressed to the Principal) within 8 days of the test/s stating the reason for missing the test/s with requisite proof/authenticated documents.

Eligibility for

Additional Semester End Examination

Conditions:

- (1) Absent for some / all course exams on
 - a. Medical grounds
 - b. Representing college or university for sports/cultural/NSS/NCC activities / camps
- (2) Fails in one/some/all courses
- (3) Submit application to the college office (addressed to the Principal) within 8 days of the exam/s stating the reason for missing the exam/s with requisite proof/authenticated documents.

Note: A learner who does not appear for both the Internal Assessment and Semester End examination is not eligible for the additional examination.

* SGPA: Semester Grade Point Average or GPA (calculated for individual semesters).

* CGPA; Cumulative Grade Point Average (calculated for the entire programme; i.e., taking all semesters into account).





Results - Interpretation Scaling Down* of Internal Assessment Marks

Refers to scaling down marks at internal examination as compared to the marks obtained in the Semester End Examination.

- * As per the existing regulation upto the academic year 2014-15.
- With effect from 2015-16 there will be no scaling down for 75-:25 UG programmes.
- However it will continue to be implemented for the 60:40 UG programmes.

Revaluation: can be requested before or after asking for a photocopy



What next after Additional Exams? A.T.K.T.

Allowed To Keep Terms

- (i) If FAIL Internal Assessment and/or additional internal assessment
- (ii) If FAIL Semester End Examination



and/or additional examination

(iii) Credits of either one are carried forward

What next after Additional Exams? A.T.K.T. Exams – When?

Are conducted in the same Semester in the next Year

e.g., Semester I exam is conducted in September-October

Therefore, the A.T.K.T. examination for Semester I is conducted in September-October of the next year

Eligibility for Promotion to the Second Year (1) Passed First Year Semesters I and II in full OR

(2) Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester I and Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester II

A.T.K.T. can be internal and/or Semester End assessment

Eligibility for Promotion to the Third Year

(1) Passed all Semesters I, II, III and IV in full

OR

(2) Passed First Year Semesters I and II in full and A.T.K.T. in Second Year with

Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester III and

Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester IV

OR

(3) Passed Second Year Semesters III and IV in full and A.T.K.T. in First Year with

Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester I and

Maximum 2 A.T.K.T. in Semester II

A.T.K.T. can be internal and/or semester end assessment

Eligibility for Third Year Semester VI Exam

- (1) Passed all Semesters I,II, III, IV and V in full OR
- (2) Passed Semesters I, II, III, IV but Failed all/few courses in Semester V OR

Not cleared Semesters in either First Year or Second Year

The learner can appear for Semester VI but the results will be held in reserve by the University till all the Semesters I, II, III, IV, and V have been cleared in full.
