- 12. The Broad Categories of Unfair Means Resorted to by Students at the University/College/Institution Examinations and the Quantum of Punishment for each Category Thereof
- S.No. Nature of Malpractice

Quantum of Punishement

(1) Possession of copying material

e.g., written or printed matter on paper, mobiles, palms, etc.

- (2) Actual copying from the copying material.
- (3) Possession of another student's answer-book.
- (4) Possession of another student's answer-book+actual evidence of copying therefrom.
- (5) Mutual / Mass copying
- (6) (i) Smuggling-out or smugglingin of answerbook as copying material.
 - (ii) Smuggling-in of written answer-book based on the question paper set at the examination.







- The reading material like reference books / Question papers / Newspapers / Syllabus issued on the Reading Room card should be returned on the same day.










The ASL is the Students' Council Body of St. Andrew's College, and is constituted in accordance with the guidelines of the Maharashtra Act.
