### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

#### "Character is Destiny"

Heraclitus (cc. 500 BC)

This short epigram is profound. The early Greek philosophers understood the importance of character formation as an essential part of a good education. The Curriculum was designed to instil moral and ethical principles, especially in young children. Accordingly, texts were chosen that met with this requirement. The philosophers that followed were Plato and Aristotle and their famous debate about including Homer's epics as part of the curriculum is discussed even today.

Aesop, who lived about the same time between 620-564 BC, is well remembered as a fabulist and storyteller and his fables characterised by anthropomorphic animal characters have a moral ending. Closer home, the Jataka Tales, dated between 300 BC to 400 AD also contain moral lessons.



The moral or didactic element was almost a pre-requirement for any story that was written. Unfortunately, as civilization progressed, we have retreated from the Golden Age, the Silver Age, the Bronze Age, the Heroic Age, the Iron Age, the Plastic Age and now the Digital Age, where all moral and ethical values are almost non-existent.

Modern education today lays great stress on cultivating the intellect and often, other considerations are neglected. Moral values, beliefs and behaviours need to be taught at a very early age, both by parents and educators. Heraclitus states that the way we shape them, will lay the foundation for future circumstances they encounter. It therefore follows, that a person with a strong moral character who embodies honesty, integrity and discipline will act in accordance with these virtues. Over time, their character influences the decisions they make, the relationships they form, and the opportunities that come their way. *Inevitably, people destiny will be woven with experiences that mirror their character, leading them down a path that corresponds to their moral compass.* 

Contrastingly, those who possesses a weak or flawed character, lacking in virtues such as honesty, integrity and discipline, may find themselves confronted with adversity and regrets. Their character attracts unfavourable circumstances and hinders their potential for growth. While external factors undoubtedly influence our lives, Heraclitus' quote reminds us that it is our character that shapes how we navigate the challenges and opportunities that come our way.

We are committed to provide a holistic education for our students by integrating the Intelligent Quotient with the Emotional and Spiritual Quotients. But values are caught and not taught and it is for us to set before our students, exemplary values we would like them to emulate, not because, in the Digital Age, 'Big Brother is Watching You', but because integrity of character is judged by 'Doing the right thing, even when No One is watching.' In this way we carve our destiny, and we can say, in the words of William Ernest Henley, "I am the master of my fate, I am the captain of my soul".

We pray that God may bless our Management, Staff and Students who work towards making this dream a reality.

## **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

### **DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH**

The Department of English has been actively engaged in organising enriching activities aimed at fostering academic growth and cultural exploration in our students. Here is an overview of the diverse events and initiatives undertaken in this academic year:

Karola Schmidt, a Research Assistant at the Chair of English Linguistics at Justus Liebig University Giessen, Germany, pursuing a PhD project on a short-term diachronic exploration of the possibility of a South Asian epicentre of English (part of a larger project 'Epicentres in World Englishes: Empirical Diachronic Studies of Present-Day South Asian Englishes' funded by the German Research Foundation) visited us on 30 June 2023. Looking to appreciate the specific variety of English used in the Indian Subcontinent, Ms. Schmidt was on a research stay at the University of Mumbai, Department of English. As part of her effort to gain access to local research into English in India and to conduct a small-scale sociolinguistic survey, she delivered a lecture to our third-year students together with third-year students and faculty from the Department of English, National College, Bandra. Her engaging lecture provided valuable insights into the evolution of English language usage in South Asia, benefiting both faculty and students.

The department organized a national workshop on 'Awareness about Tribal Language and Literature,' featuring expert sessions by Prof. Dr. Santosh Rathod and Prof. Samajdar Valawake on 19 August, 2023. Attendees gained a deeper understanding of tribal literature and its challenges in India, contributing to a broader appreciation of cultural diversity.

The Department initiated a 30-hour skill development course on Creative Writing. It was led by Mr. Berges Santok (industry expert and visiting faculty at the BAMMC Department of our college) and Ms. Shruti Warrier (Assistant Professor, Department of English, St. Andrew's College). Designed to enhance students' writing skills across various media, the course covered topics such as fiction, non-fiction, video content for social media, copywriting for advertising, storytelling for gaming, and screenwriting for films and OTT. With 55 enthusiastic participants, the course aimed to nurture budding writers and content creators.

In celebration of National Comic Book Month, the department organized 'Comic Crusade,' a daylong event on 2 September, 2023 showcasing the cultural significance of comic books and movies. From an art competition to cosplay and movie screenings, the event provided a platform for students to express their creativity and passion for the comic world.

The department hosted a hybrid-mode conference on 'Food and Literature,' on 12 January, 2024 attracting scholars, writers, and food enthusiasts from across the country. Through keynote speeches, panel discussions, and paper presentations, participants explored the intricate relationship between food and literature, enriching their understanding of cultural symbolism and sensory experiences. Ms. Eleanor Pinto, our Keynote Speaker's lecture on "IN-DIGESTION: Literatures of Decoloniality, Philosophies of Difference," examined the subject of food from a feminist and philosophical perspective. Our invited speaker, Ms. Prerna Jatav (Department of English, National College, Bandra West) delivered a talk on "Aromatic Manipulations by Women through Food: Secret Ingredient towards Agency." Yet another invited speaker Ms. Pamela Nandi (Engineer at IBM and Independent food blogger) presented an intriguing paper on "The Evolution of Food Writing and its Impact on Culinary Traditions," tracing the historical development of food literature and its influence on gastronomic practices. The History Department inaugurated its field visits in August with a visit to the Discovery of India Exposition at the Nehru Centre, Worli. Though a part of the gallery was under renovation, the S.Y.B.A. and T.Y.B.A. students were able to gain an interesting insight into some of the highlights of Ancient and Medieval India. The National Movement gallery proved to be very popular as students were amazed by the many photographs of our national leaders and iconic movements like the Dandi March. A few months later, the T.Y.B.A. students spent half a day at the Nehru Science Centre. This may seem an odd choice for History Students. However, the Science Centre is a leading example of how museums are excellent agents of Non- Nonformal education. Enhancing the Museology paper of the final year, the students were able to appreciate the interactive and informative design of the museum. While we were there, numerous school students excitedly shared with us how the museum helped them to understand and learn basic scientific concepts. The newly established Indian Space Exploration gallery proved to be a

worthy addition to the museum. The students also enjoyed the 'playground' which serves to teach concepts like balance, how sound travels, weights and muscle power and the movement of pendulums.

### Commemoration of National and International Days

Our last visit for the year was to Mani Bhavan on 30 January 2024 to commemorate Martyr's Day. Mani Bhavan, originally owned by the Jhaveris, was the residence of choice for Mahatma Gandhi between 1917 and 1934. The house thus became the nerve centre of the National Movement in Mumbai. Now converted into a museum and library, it contains a large collection of photographs, books, letters and personal items of Mahatma Gandhi. We chose to visit on Martyr's Day as a poignant reminder of the sacrifice Mahatma Gandhi made as a prophet of peace.

The History Department also decided to commemorate World Environment Health Day and Constitution Day. For World Environment Health Day on 26 September 2023, we opted to conduct a free sapling distribution drive. Thus the students began preparing and planting saplings a few days earlier. We selected Philodendron Burle Marx, a versatile plant that does not need much care and makes for a competent windowsill or balcony plant, even for a novice plant parent. The TYBA students prepared a QR code detailing simple care tips and we distributed 50 free saplings. On Constitution Day (Samvidhan Diwas), the History Department shared a small video on the making of the Indian Constitution and its unique features. The video itself was created by an earlier History batch.

#### **Film and Documentary Screenings**

Beginning in July, the department also screened a number of *documentaries* and *films* to complement the curriculum. In particular, the Talking History series by Rajya Sabha TV and Live India History documentaries are invaluable for Medieval Indian History. Additionally, the *Centre Art Studio*'s short videos on Museum restoration are an invaluable addition to the students' understanding of conservation. In September, we also inaugurated the Chadrayaan Film Festival, screening films/documentaries related to space exploration. The movie *Hidden Figures* was screened in class and other prominent films and important documentaries were shared as links for the students to view.

#### **Guest Lecture**

Our activities for the year drew to a close with a guest lecture by Professor Dr. Kashmira Mody, retired Head of the Economics Department and the first Professor of St. Andrew's College. Professor Mody provided an excellent insight into the Liberalization, Privatization, Globalization programme that transformed the Indian Economy under PM Narasimha Rao and Dr. Manmohan Singh. The History Department expresses its gratitude to Dr. Mody for graciously sharing her knowledge and time.

The History Department also expresses its thanks to the *Archdiocese Museum of Christian Heritage Goregaon* and *Cipla Archives* for providing internship opportunities for the department students.

### **DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTANCY**

#### Skill development courses / training programs

A 30 hours certificate course on Goods & Service Tax was organized from 18 April 2023 to 24 June 2023. The 12 theory sessions of 2 hours each were delivered online on Zoom platform and the practical sessions were conducted offline in the college's computer lab. An additional 2 hours online exam was also conducted for all the participants on the Zoom platform. The course conducted by Edutech Centre by faculties CA Rupal Haria & CA Dipti Mody provided training related to registration, time-value-place of supply, input tax credit and return filing of GST. 16 students undertook the training. The students were given certificates at the end of the programme.

### ICAI Foundation Day and GST Day

On 1 and 2 July 2023, ICAI Foundation Day & GST Day was celebrated. On the occasion, 18 S.Y. and T.Y.B.COM students participated and submitted charts and articles to enhance awareness of GST and CA course.

### Andrean Accountancy Bulletin Board

In June 2023, articles were invited from B.Com students from newspapers/ magazines related to Accountancy/ Finance and Taxation along with comments of students to be displayed on the Accountancy Notice board. 42 B.Com students participated in this event.

### Visit to MET institute

On January 19 2024, 30 students of T.Y.B.COM visited the MET Institute. The visit covered a series of Mock Personal Interviews (PI), Group Discussions (GD), and Aptitude Tests conducted by MET Asian Management Development Centre. These activities were strategically designed to provide students with a simulated experience akin to real-world academic assessments, offering them a valuable opportunity to refine their skills and enhance their readiness for future applications. The exposure to a simulated academic environment equipped them with the confidence and acumen necessary to navigate future assessments and admissions processes for higher education.

#### **Investor awareness programme**

On 1 February 2024, an Investor Awareness Programme was organised from 10:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. in the AV Room. The programme, attended by 78 students, was conducted to help them understand the basic concept of investment, the stock market, mutual funds, and smart investors and to learn how to build long-term investments. The speaker Ms. Soniya Mashelkar, an alumnus of our college and a certified NISM trainer (National Institute of Securities Markets) gave a brief introduction to the Stock Market, making students aware of the rules and regulations of trading in the market. She then elaborated on the precautions to be taken before buying stocks, educating young investors about the financial markets, investment opportunities and risks. The students were actively engaged throughout the program through a Q&A session. The session concluded with a vote of thanks given by Ms. Riya Singh.

### Analysis of Interim Budget 2024

On 15 February 2024, students participated in a competition wherein they had to make a presentation on the topic 'Analysis of Interim Budget 2024'. The competition helped students understand the Interim Budget 2024 and its implications. ### **DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE**

The Andrean Department of Commerce had an exciting year filled with a number of co-curricular activities and events for the academic year 2023-24. The Department of Commerce also conducted its first-ever 30 hour skill development course on Social Media Marketing which got a huge response from students. Besides this, the other activities are as follows.

On 10 August 2023, a guest speaker session on "Public Relations as an Edge over Advertising" was conducted by our alumnus, Mr Sanjay Lawrence. There were over 50 participants from various streams and the students were given insights on Public Relations. Mr Lawrence drew attention to the abundant opportunities in the field. He added a personal touch by sharing his life story from holding a finance graduate degree to presently working as a Communication professional for Fleishman Hillard handling consumer tech and BFSI clients. He emphasised that where Advertising can be transactional, Public Relations can be transformational.

To give students an opportunity to flaunt their creative skills, the Department of Commerce organised a "Logo Making Competition" on 10 August 2023. The competition had 12 participants and students from various streams participated. The 1<sup>st</sup> place went to Aarti Jaiswar from S.Y.B.A. for her artistic design for 'AJ classes'. The 2<sup>nd</sup> place went to Merlyn Louis from S.Y.B.Com for her unique logo for 'Vision for Tomorrow'. The 3<sup>rd</sup> place went to Aishwarya Bhatara for her creative logo for 'Katha Comics'.

The Department of Commerce addresses not only curricular-based learning but also skill-based learning. The Department, in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Digital Education, organised a 30-hour Skill Development Course on Social Media Marketing that commenced on 18/8/2023 and concluded on 6/9/2023. 41 students registered for it. The course included video lectures, orientation sessions, and practical

Students were oriented about the course objectives and the landscape of social media marketing during the orientation session. Throughout the course, students were presented with video lectures to understand the power and intricacies of social media marketing. Interactive sessions covered topics such as platform differentiation, content formats, paid marketing fundamentals, and objective setting. Practical sessions included activities like setting targeting parameters, utilizing Facebook Pixel, and understanding analytics for effective campaign creation. Selfpractice sessions allowed students to apply their learnings through hands-on experience, while mentoring sessions provided guidance in creating social media marketing campaigns. Overall, the course provided a holistic learning experience encompassing both theoretical knowledge and practical skills essential for successful social media marketing.

On 11 January 2024, the Department held yet another successful skill development workshop for the students led by Dr Svetlana Tathuskar on the topic of Group Discussion, Resume Writing and Personal Interview. The workshop had over 40 participants and had students attending from across streams. Students were provided with guidance on the proper and improper practices of composing resumes and participating in group discussions. Additionally, the students were also given insights on how to communicate in formal environments, handle disputes in a formal setting, and conflict resolution when many people with different ideologies are put together.

On 18 January 2024, the Department organised a competition based on the Experiential Visit of the First year B.Com Students to a mall. The students presented their views about and shared what they learnt from the visit. The first place went to Ceona Pinto, Reona Pinto and Cargan Christom of F.Y.B.Com. This lecture helped students to understand the Art of Public Speaking and the ability to communicate effectively in front of an audience. In this session, students learned how to articulate their thoughts clearly and persuasively, a valuable skill in both, academic and professional contexts. During the latter half of the academic year, a workshop on 'Data Interpretation' was conducted by Prof. Ajay Gupta on 2 March, 2024. This session gave the students an insight into how to analyse, understand, and draw meaningful insights from data to make informed decisions, solve problems, and communicate findings effectively.

### **B.SC. HOSPITALITY DEPARTMENT**

This year, the Department of Hospitality Studies arranged numerous educational and engaging events and workshops for the students. The seminars provided an opportunity to learn varied skills, from plating to creating various pasta dishes to choosing different drinks.

The first activity on 8 July 2023 was 'Perfect Homes Are Made Not Bought' by guest speaker Professor Trupti Laghate. She emphasised that interior design is more than just placing furniture in the right places; it is also about creating rooms that are practical, beautiful, and that represent the personalities of people and businesses. This session provided students with an extensive and varied field of study and practice, ranging from investigating various styles and trends to comprehending how locations impact mood and behavior.

A visit to Sun N Sand hotel on both the 24 and 28 of July 2023 was arranged by Professor Archie Fernandes for the first-year students. The students were exposed to the high standards of service expected of them, while also learning about the intricate operations of the food and beverage department. Hands-on experience with the restaurant equipment provided practical knowledge and was complemented by an understanding of operational procedures. Additionally, students delved into the dynamic inter-departmental relationships within the hotel, a crucial aspect of ensuring smooth operations. By the end of the visit, participants emerged with a deeper appreciation for the complexities of the

hospitality sector and the skills necessary for success in it.

On 2 August 2023, a workshop led by Chef Sushant Khandagale, called 'Pasta Perfecto,' introduced students to a fascinating culinary excursion that involved all of the senses from making the dough from scratch to learning to hand-cut different shapes of freshly made pasta with traditional sauce.

On August 5, 2023, a workshop on plating was led by Chef Berndraf Dias, titled 'Your Plate is a Canvas.' It helped students master the use of spatulas and tweezers, coordinating colours, textures and proportions to transform simple items into visually spectacular works of art. Students learned how presentation can elevate the dining experience, giving their culinary creations a dash of sophistication and appeal.

On August 9, 2023, 'Martini n More', by Mr. Vishal Kanojia touched upon different aspects of making cocktails. Students mastered the process of mixing cocktails and learned about the alchemy of flavors as they combined ancient recipes with new twists. On August 12, 2023, students came together under the skilled guidance of Professor Jayashree Kakde to begin an exciting adventure known as 'The Six Pillars'. Students explored the world of spirits in-depth during two fascinating hours, learning about their history, production methods, and distinctive qualities. They investigated the finer points of production and distillation to obtain a thorough grasp of what constitutes a spirit in a beverage. They became well-versed in service protocols and learned about a wide range of spirit brands through intensive training. In addition, participants learned about the subcategories that exist within each of the six spirits, developing their ability to recognize and value them.

First-year students participated in a session by Mr. Jaydeep Tahashildar titled 'Creative Communication About Commodity Service' on October 9, 2023. They learnt about various investment options, risk factors, and financial strategies. Under the guidance of Ms. Anna Bredemeyer, students embarked on a transformative journey of 'Personality Development' on January 31, February 1, and February 2, 2024. The sessions served as a crucible for honing essential life skills, focusing on communication prowess, emotional intelligence, assertiveness, and confidence cultivation. By nurturing self-awareness and empathy, participants emerged with a profound understanding of themselves and others, equipped to navigate the intricate tapestry of social and professional landscapes with grace and finesse.

Amidst a whirlwind of excitement and anticipation, the students of the third-year along with the help of first-year students embarked on a journey of culinary delight and entrepreneurial adventure known as 'Flavorful Fete.' Held on February 12 and 13, 2024, this annual extravaganza, led by the professors, provided students with hands-on experience of event management in its truest form. From meticulously planning every intricate detail to orchestrating marketing sponsorships and crafting delectable menus, students were granted a backstage pass to the inner workings of the event management industry. To encourage entrepreneurship, the opportunity to set up small pop-up stalls was provided so students could discover the thrill of translating their passion into profit.

The Alcoholic Beverage Symposium held on March 12, 2023 was a collaborative effort by the second-year students in the Food and Beverage Service Department, with the guidance of Prof. Crystal Rocha. The participants were divided into 8 groups, and utilized a variety of engaging methods such as 3D models, presentations, interactive games, and discussions on fun facts and popular brands, to gain comprehensive insights into the world of alcoholic beverages. This creative and multi-dimensional approach not only enhanced the learning experience but also made the symposium both informative and entertaining.

### **CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

### UNESCO/CARDINAL PAUL POUPARD FOUNDATION CHAIR for INTERRELIGIOUS AND INTERCULTURAL DIALOGUE

India's rich array of cultures, traditions, languages, and religions showcases its remarkable diversity. To promote this, the UNESCO/ Cardinal Paul Poupard Foundation Chair for Interreligious and Intercultural Dialogue hosted many events to showcase the richness of Indian culture and religion.

In order to familiarise the students with the Chair and its functions, an Orientation was conducted on 2nd August, 2023 and 12th August, 2023 by the Core team comprising Ann Maureen Mathew, Justin Fernandes, Tanya Da Costa and Keturah Shetty. (TYBCom). Overall, 120 students were present and each of them eagerly participated in the activities for the upcoming year. On 17th August, 2023, the Annual Quiz Competition titled 'InQUIZitive' was conducted on the theme "Intertwining Water and Culture". The quiz tested the participants' knowledge about and strengthened their awareness of India's water bodies, conservation systems, and positive water practices while also inculcating a sense of respect and responsibility towards water resources. The team comprising Arnold Fernandes (TYBcom), Elroy D'souza (TYBcom) and Simion Fernandes (TYBcom) were declared winners.

The Chair organised the Annual "Strings of Peace" event on 30th August, 2023 where stalls were set up to sell coloured strings handmade by the students of the creative team. Students actively participated in this event as an expression of love, peace, harmony, and unity with one another amidst their diversity. On 6th January, 2024, students visited the "Mahalaxmi Saras Exhibition" at Bandra Kurla Complex, organised by the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) that provides a platform to rural artisans to promote and sell their crafts. The visit gave insight to the students about various cultural and ancient artefacts, hand-made items, food, and clothes, thereby promoting an understanding of Indian Rural culture.

On 11th January, 2024, the Chair organised a Debate Competition on the theme "Progression and Concrete Jungles vs. Nature and Adjusted Living". The two student teams eloquently worded their respective arguments. The team for "Nature and Adjusted Living" won the event. The winning team consisted of Vibhanshu Upadhyay (SYBcom B), Maryann Barreto (TYBcom A), Ceona Pinto (FYBcom A) and Reina dcosta (FYBms B).

Saatotsav – The Annual Interreligious Festival spanned from 6th February, 2024 to 13th February, 2024. This seven-day spectacle truly encapsulated the diversity of our nation with a variety of events.

On day 1, (6th February 2024) various Ancient Indian Board Games of Ludo, Chess, and Snakes and Ladders were introduced, tracing their origin and purpose. This helped bridge the gap between knowledge of seemingly contemporary games and their ancient roots. Students also played certain rounds of the respective games. On day 2, (7th February 2024) Riha Dinware and Anna Augustine presented a Film Analysis of the movie '*The Great Indian Kitchen*'. The movie encompasses patriarchy, the repression of women, and many other problems faced in Indian culture. This led to a thought-provoking discussion among the students.

On day 3, (8th February 2024), "Swado ka Sangham," engrossed students with the origins and preparations of various Indian cuisines, culminating in a PEACE MEAL. Each student traced and studied the origins, stories and significance of different delicacies across various

Indian states, concluding with a vast delicious spread ranging from chole bhature to rasgulla.

A Poetry Competition on Day 4, (9th February 2024)was held on the theme "*Water and Humans*". Many students presented their original poems, highlighting the relationship between human beings and water. The winner of this competition was Joanna Fernandes, SYBA A. There was a Reel-Making Session on day 5 on the theme "UNESCO heritage sites in India". For this competition, students were asked to make short videos (reels) highlighting the diversity in our culture.

It was a moment of national pride when 'Garba of Gujarat' was inscribed in UNESCO's Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. To celebrate this recognition, on Day 6, (12th February 2024) the Chair organised a Garba Dance Workshop by Scenty Sunny. This was preceded by a PowerPoint Presentation and discussion on the significance and origin of Garba. A Field trip was organised to the Iskcon temple and Haji Ali Dargah on the 7<sup>th</sup> Day (19th February 2024) of Saatotsay, to provide students with tangible experiences. Furthermore, this served to promote critical thinking and enhance observational skills related to the diversity and rich cultural depiction of different religions.

The Student Research Journal, 'The Sacred Times' – A Monograph Vol.2. with an ISBN No. was published on 30th April 2024. This helped students hone their analytical skills, improve writing skills, and gain experience in academic communication.

Ignite 2023-24 – the Bi-annual Magazine, was published in April 2024. The magazine seeks to represent the diversity of heritage and cultural expressions through the variety of student articles, essays, poems etc., thereby enabling a platform for the expression of literary skills.

Throughout the year, the Chair had a Weekly Quiz through our social media handles, encouraging students to expand their knowledge about different heritages, religions, and culture.

# Diploma in Religion and Society, Peace and Dialogue

The Diploma course began the year by awarding certificates to three students, viz. Gaurav Tiwari, Stency Simon and Abuzaid Peringlalam upon their successful completion of the diploma course. During the year, Batch 8 students completed all their modules and handed in their assignments during the summer vacations to qualify for their diplomas. We express our appreciation to Dr. Shilpa Chedda, Dr. Deepa Jaydev and Dr. Harmeet Bhasin for conducting the Jainism, Buddhism and Sikhism modules.

Dr. Shilpa Chedda also graciously organized a visit to the Jain Temple at Hill Road Bandra on 24 August 2023. Since the temple had a Jain monk in residence at the time, the students spent an hour quizzing him on his journey as a spiritual leader and the teachings and practice of Jainism. A detailed guided visit to the temple followed and we were deeply touched by the kindness of the faithful who stopped to talk to us and offer their insights so that we could better understand their faith.

The Diploma course added a student to Batch 9 this year and these students completed 5 modules of the course. As they step into the final year of college, the students look forward to earning their diplomas.

### Life Skill Programme (FIRST YEAR)

Two sessions were conducted for first year students during the academic year focusing primarily on managing relationships and holistic development.

A session was conducted on 'Healthy Breathing and Pulmonary Disorders' (18, 21 & 22 August 2023) by Dr. Revathy. The facilitator began the first half of session by exploring the impact of lifestyle factors such as smoking, pollution, and exercise on lung health The speaker highlighted common pulmonary disorders such as asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and pulmonary fibrosis, including their causes, symptoms, and risk factors The second half of the session focused on the role of healthcare professionals in diagnosing and treating pulmonary disorders, including the importance of regular check-ups and screenings which are essential for the health well-being of an individual.

A session was conducted on 'Habits of Healthy Relationship' (11 & 13 September 2023) by Ms. Kimberly Lobo. The facilitator emphasized the need for identifying common unhealthy relationship dynamics and behaviours, such as manipulation, co-dependency, and lack of boundaries that hamper a healthy relationship. The facilitator further reflected on personal values, goals, and priorities in relationships and created a plan for fostering healthier habits and connections for bridging gaps in a relationship. Overall, the session helped students gain insight into creating, maintaining, and preserving relationships in the long run.

### SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME (AIDED SECTION)

The Social Outreach Programme for this academic year was a joint effort between Project Mumbai and St. Andrew's College. It aimed to nurture a sense of social responsibility among the students. Commencing with meetings in April and June, the stakeholders deliberated on the events and activities planned for the upcoming year, laying the groundwork for what would be a transformative journey. There was an orientation session held for 460 students of SYBA/SYB.COM on 22 June 2023 aimed at sensitising students to the adversities faced by marginalised segments of society, aligning with the compassionate teachings of Christ, and emphasising avenues for proactive societal contribution.

Core team leaders and sub-leaders were formed to streamline operations and foster a culture of transparency and efficiency. There was a crucial meeting on September 12, 2023, where the final list of SOP activities, including Naksha, Jallosh, and Plastic Recyclothon, was confirmed. Naksha was an initiative that promoted cultural, communal and historical upliftment. Students were assigned roads across the neighbouring areas in Mumbai where they gathered information about the streets and talked to the locals and the people residing in that locality. The activity of Jallosh aimed at beach cleanup drives. Students also conducted a survey on the pollution on beaches and in water bodies. Plastic Recyclathon aimed to help manage the plastic waste generated by collection and disposing it with the help of Project Mumbai to recycle the waste plastic. This initiative also looked at conducting surveys on ways to reduce plastic pollution. From heightened environmental awareness and conscientious waste management to the cultivation of resilience in the face of challenges and a deeper appreciation for cultural heritage through activities like Naksha, the reports serve as a testament to the holistic impact of the Social Outreach Programme.

### SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME (SELF FINANCE SECTION)

In an era marked by societal challenges, the Social Outreach Program of St. Andrew's College stands out as a beacon of hope, striving to address pressing issues and foster positive change. The Social Outreach Program completed its 18<sup>th</sup> year. In 2006, the outreach program was promoted by our Principal Dr. Marie Fernandes in collaboration with Fr. Allwyn D'Silva. The objective of the program is to sensitize students, in keeping with the teachings of Christ, to the hardships faced by the poor and marginalized people of society.

The Social Outreach Program is mandatory for the second-year students of St. Andrew's College, who are required to complete a minimum of 20 hours of volunteer work. This year, the Social Outreach Program (SOP) for Self-Financed (BSc I.T, BMM, BBI, BAF & BMS) students was organized by our collaborating NGO partner CSA (Centre for Social Action).

The Centre for Social Action, headed by Fr. Joseph Gonsalves (Director of CSA) helped us in designing the SOP for this year. An orientation program was held for students by the professorsin-charge and the Centre for Social Action team, where the students were briefed about the Social Outreach Program, and given detailed guidelines for completing the online SOP. The outreach initiatives this year encompassed a variety of intervention groups, each targeting specific areas of social need. These groups included the following: Ashakiran Community Centre, FMM S, Mahila Balvikas Kendra, Dev Kripa Mandal, Canossa Jeevan Vikas Kendra, Prerna Seva Kendra, Sahajeevan Samaj Kendra, and Savdhan Samaj Kendra.

This year the SOP was conducted offline, and students were given two hours to complete their tasks. The Plan of Action was Group type-specific Orientation -2 hours, Meet and Greet with the group -2 hours, Preparing sessions for the group -2 hours, Other Activities -12 hours and Report and Documentation -2 hours.

The AI tools taught were Arloopa, Google Lens, Photomath, Remove.bg, Google Translate, Chatbox – Gemini; Chat GPT, Blackbox, Gamma, Canva, Ideogram and Fliki. By the end, the attendees received actionable insights and a heightened appreciation for the transformative potential of AI in administrative contexts.

The following day, on 27 April 2024, Dr. Karuna Gokarn Vice Principal (Academics) of St. Xavier's College, Mumbai, delivered a talk on the National Education Policy (NEP). Dr. Gokarn's lucid presentation provided the teaching staff with some much-needed clarity on the structure of the NEP, its terminology, and the meaning and implications of its key verticals for the staff and the students. While Dr. Gokarn shared with the teaching staff how the NEP had been implemented at St. Xavier's College, she also informed the participants about how St. Xavier's College had utilised their status as an autonomous institution to adapt the NEP to suit the needs of their institution to the benefit their staff and students. As an affiliated college preparing for the implementation of the NEP in the upcoming academic year, Dr. Gokarn's talk was timely and thus, much appreciated by our staff.

### **COLLEGE WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL (CWDC)**

The College Women Development Cell (CWDC) broadened its scope to encompass and support the recognition of not only the freedom and rights of women, but also of all gender identities currently defined in our community.

The movie industry has recently been debunking stereotypes about the LGBTQIA+ community in light of the global focus on this group, promoting positive attitudes toward it, and erasing several stigmas associated with it. Students of the committee analysed the Pakistani cinematic masterpiece, "Joyland" on January 12, 2024 to promote greater knowledge and awareness of gender and sexual orientation.

Rights and empowerment go hand in hand. Since marriage is an unavoidable element of a person's life, it is critical and necessary that spouses understand their legal rights. It is critical that women understand the distinction between what constitutes an unfair treatment of them in any type of relationship in our patriarchal society. To address this, the CWDC hosted a guest lecture titled "Ask the Legal Expert " on January 13, 2024, featuring top legal expert Advocate Sr. Kajal Solanki. The discussion ranged from marital rights to community rights for LGBTQIA+ people.

Given that the menstrual cycle is an inevitable and regular occurrence for all women, it is critical to consider eco-friendly measures related to menstrual hygiene and comfort. Since the majority of menstrual products are made chemically, many environmentalists are concerned about how one disposes of them. Renowned experts Mr. Milton Fernandes and Dr. Meril Fernandes conducted a lecture on "Menstrual Hygiene: An Environmental Perspective" on January 17, 2024, to develop ecoconscious behaviour. They imparted valuable knowledge about more environment-friendly menstrual product substitutes while maintaining the goal of sustainability.

Through a Photography Contest called "Women's Diaries," which was conducted on January 19, 2024, the CWDC used this art form to highlight everyday struggles and life. Students were asked to photograph a moment in a woman's life that represented her daily struggles and bring to light an untold story that would otherwise go unnoticed.

Considering all the taboos and conventions around it, gender and equality sensitization has become imperative. When engaging in any conversation concerning someone's sexual orientation, students need to exercise caution. On February 2, 2024, college counsellor Ms. Kimberly Lobo gave a talk titled "Gender Sensitivity" to help the students become more aware of the same and pave the way for the formation of an inclusive group called Gender Champions in the coming years as per the University of Mumbai guidelines.

### NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) NSS MOTTO- 'NOT ME BUT YOU'

Our NSS unit started the academic year 2023-24 with a spirit of sensitization towards societal issues. The NSS team for the year was led by 7 leaders (1 female, 6 male) and Programme Officer Prof. Jordin Carvalho.

The aim for the year was to serve the community through various social outreach programs and increase awareness, knowledge, and citizenship among volunteers through a range of seminars and college and university level activities.

The year began with 100 volunteers (32 male and 68 female) including new enrolments, who were selected on the basis of their personalities, willingness to learn and develop, dedication and commitment by the leaders. Out of these 100 volunteers, 18 volunteers successfully completed 240 hours of service in the NSS unit by participating in activities throughout the two years of their commitment. These volunteers also attended the annual Camp and received a certificate from the Central Government under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. Throughout their service, the volunteers participated in planning and conducting various activities. They exhibited a sense of responsibility, hard work, and teamwork. This year, 26 volunteers successfully

completed 120 hours of service in the first year and hence, will continue to be a part of the Unit for the next academic year. This year was especially important and challenging for us as we had finally started offline activities without restrictions after two years of being confined to stay indoors. Our NSS unit successfully organized and participated in 79 activities throughout the academic year.

#### Some of the major activities that took place in this academic year include:

#### **Community Activities/Area-based projects:**

#### **Beach Cleanups and Awareness Drives:**

This year, our unit participated in beach cleanups with the Beach Warriors of Khushiyaan NGO at Dadar and Juhu beach. Regular beach and mangroves cleanups in collaboration with Swaccha Vasundhara Abhiyaan were also conducted on weekends at Carter's Beach, Bandra. These cleanups were a symbol of the change that little acts can bring about. Our Unit participated in 16 Beach cleanups throughout the year including the Aksa beach clean-up organized by the Shakti Plastic Industries and The Times of India on 24 February 2024. Tons of plastic and other waste were collected, segregated, and disposed of with the efforts of our volunteers this year.

#### Bandra fair Volunteering:

Our NSS unit volunteered at the Bandra Fair and assisted the Mumbai police in crowd control, traffic management, security and guiding the pilgrims at Mount Mary in our second area-based project. From 10th to 17th of September 2023, NSS volunteers worked hard to help the police and the church community have a safe and joyful Bandra Fair. Volunteers assisted elderly people, pregnant women, and disabled people in completing their pilgrimage. They provided help with directions, checked bags for security purposes, and maintained queues and traffic control. This was also a great opportunity for volunteers to develop their personalities, contribute to the community, and make many beautiful memories during the 8 days of volunteering. Our NSS unit was also felicitated for their work by the Mumbai police on 6 October 2023.

#### Voter awareness Street play:

NSS volunteers performed a street play on the topic 'Voter awareness' on 27 January 2024 at Carter's Road to make people aware of the upcoming elections and help them realise the importance of every person's vote. The volunteers wrote the script for the play and invested long hours of practice too.

#### **College Activities:**

#### **Blood Donation Camp:**

The blood donation camp was organized in our college in collaboration with the K.E.M. Hospital on 18 January 2024. NSS volunteers conducted poster making events on the topic 'Blood donation awareness'; they were used for class-to-class promotions. They brought to the camp more than 70 motivated and potential donors. We were successful in collecting 49 units of blood.

#### **Book Donation Drive:**

The book donation drive was organized in our college in collaboration with the NGO, The Movement. The Book collection week was organized from 27 January to 3 February 2024 and the collected books were donated on 6 March 2024. NSS volunteers made a significant contribution by collecting 190 books. These

books were donated with an initiative to build small libraries across vulnerable communities in Mumbai.

Various seminars on topics like Anti Human Trafficking, Organ donation, Blood Stem Cell Donation, Public Concern for Governance Trust (PCGT), etc. were also held in the college during the year. Poster making competitions, Voter Registration and Awareness Programme, Joy of Giving, Volunteering for Mosaic were also some activities held in college this year.

We conducted several activities like geographical land art, morning exercises, shramdaan, village anganwadi visits, poster making, tree plantation, street play practices, trekking, Sane Guruji Smarak Visit, bird-watching, and presentation of the street plays at the Goregaon bus depot during this period. The Placement Cell, in collaboration with the Department of Management Studies, commenced with a guest lecture titled "Personal Branding and Interview Insights" by Mr Gavin Rego on 6 July 2023. Students received insights on the measures to be followed during an interview and were also sensitised on interview etiquette and body language. The Placement Cell further collaborated with the Foreign University Cell on the topic "Study and Work Abroad Opportunities in New Zealand" with New Zealand Education Advisors Limited. This guest lecture was organised on 10 February 2024; the team introduced our students to different opportunities for higher education and jobs in New Zealand and were also given insights into the seamless process of applying to New Zealand.

In the course of the year, the Placement Cell adopted a hybrid approach in the Pre-Placement Talks. Pre-placements talks were conducted virtually by Delta X and Harjai Computers for the final year students. Both companies aimed to acquaint the students about the various career prospects provided by the respective companies. Additionally, the students were introduced to the range of the career paths in the respective companies. The Placement Cell organised the offline Preplacement Talk by Headphone Zone. Students were given the opportunity to interact with the company representatives. Further, the company also enlightened students about the various departments and job opportunities that the company offered. The Placement Cell, in collaboration with Citizen Credit Bank, conducted a test for selection before the interview round for our third-year students on campus. This enabled students to understand the process of an interview and those who passed the test had an opportunity to give the interview with Citizen Credit Bank.

The Placement Cell has also witnessed students getting full-time placements in Morgan Stanley, Citizen Credit Bank, ICICI Prudential and Mobileware. The students also interned in reputed organisations such as Morgan Stanley, Vibgyor Advisors and Zeilhoch.

He suggested that students keep their minds open to more options since few aspirants qualify.

The Competitive Exams Committee, in collaboration with the Department of Economics and Business Economics, conducted an insightful online session on 'Careers in Economics' on 20th July 2023. The speaker for this session was Mr. Prakash Almeida. 100 students from TYBCom and TYBA attended the session. This session made the students aware of the brilliant career pathways in competitive exams with regard to Economics.

Apart from these sessions, a new initiative was undertaken to motivate students to prepare for various competitive exams. A Resources Enrichment Drive was conducted from 14th to 19th January 2024. 47 students were provided with mock and past question papers as resources on MBA-CET, CLAT, Banking entrance and civil service exams to encourage them to appear for these exams.

# TOPIC: CONTEMPLATING CURRENT CHALLENGES PERTAINING TO GLOBAL DEBT DYNAMICS.

The first session of SAMUN was conducted on 13<sup>th</sup> December to help students develop their diplomatic ability. The session began with the lighting of the lamp by Professor-in-charge of SAMUN, Ms.Pooja Joshi, and Secretary General of SAMUN, Mr. Saqlain Mansuri and Deputy Secretary of SAMUN, Ms. Kavya Jain.

The session began with Ms Pooja Joshi greeting the Executive Board members ECOSCO Chair Dhairya Shah and ECOSCO Vice Chair Aynaz Shaikh, the delegates, and the crew. The Secretary General offered a few remarks, which were then followed by remarks from the Deputy Secretary. The event began with a spirited dance performance by Shruti Nair, setting a dynamic tone. After the opening address by the UK presenter, diplomatic discussions unfolded, initiated by Australia's probing questions to the UK, leading to a heated discussion. The floor was then commandeered by Germany, introducing cross-questioning involving the UK, Australia, China, and Germany. The adept responses from the Pakistani delegate addressed all queries, accompanied by points of order introducing procedural intricacies.

A designated break was introduced for lunch and informal discussions, fostering camaraderie among delegates during the unmoderated caucus. Upon reconvening, the delegate of India shared insights during a 1 min 30 sec intervention, discussing global investment, job opportunities, and the potential boycotting of products.

A pivotal moment ensued when Germany inquired about India's stance on boycotting and sought clarity. The delegate of India underscored assistance to Palestine from PM Modi. Pakistan explored collaborations across various levels, and Australia provided an insightful follow-up.

The second day was filled with lively debates and valuable interactions. The concluding ceremony on December 14, 2023 took place at 5:30 pm, and included a recognition segment where the best delegates were awarded for their exceptional contributions, diplomacy, and engagement throughout the event. Finally, the conference ended with a closing speech given by Secretary-General Saqlain Mansuri.

### ANDREAN COUNSELLING CELL

The Andrean Counselling Cell has been instrumental in providing comprehensive support and guidance to students throughout the academic year 2023-2024. It has been committed to enhancing student well-being and fostering positive outcomes in various areas. Here's a summary of the counselling activities and interventions conducted:

1. Individual Counselling Sessions: The counselling department offered one-on-one counselling sessions to address a wide range of issues including academic stress, anxiety, depression, identity exploration, relationship issues, trauma, substance abuse, family conflict, body image, eating disorders, motivation, and emotional distress.

2. Therapy used - Tailored approaches such as cognitive-behavioural therapy (CBT) and dialectical behaviour therapy (DBT) were utilized based on the unique needs and preferences of each student. Additionally, mindfulness, imagery, and deep breathing exercises were introduced to promote emotional well-being.

**3. Career Counselling:** Students received assistance in exploring career options, decision-making, planning, and job search strategies. The department supported students in setting academic goals, improving study skills, time management, and overcoming academic challenges.

4. Collaboration and Consultation: The counselling department collaborated with the Principal, faculty, staff, and other campus stakeholders to address student concerns, discipline issues, and provide consultation on various student-related matters.

**5. Parental Meetings:** Meetings were held with parents who approached the counselling department directly or were referred by school authorities regarding discipline or academic issues faced by their children.

6. Referrals and Follow-up: Referrals were made to external support services, including mental health professionals and academic support centres, to meet the diverse needs of students. Follow-up and monitoring sessions were conducted to assess students' coping mechanisms and progress.

**7. Crisis Intervention:** The department provided crisis intervention services for students in urgent need of support.

The year started with a short PPT for the teachers of the Senior and Junior college. It covered issues such as the legal mandates of the UGC Posh Act and the POCSO Act, awareness of gender sensitivity, addressing PDA on campus, and how teachers can support the student's mental health by motivating and practising non-judgemental acceptance. The aim was to equip teachers with strategies to create a safe, inclusive, and supportive learning environment.

A 'Back to College' session was conducted for all classes to raise awareness about the counselling facilities available on campus. It was important to ensure that every student knew about the resources and support systems in place for their mental well-being."

Keeping in touch with students, the counsellor ensured that regular WhatsApp forwards about the orientation session and the availability of counselling facilities on campus were sent to all students. Midweek motivation quotes or Saturday quotes to keep in touch with students and motivate them was much appreciated by the students.

**Classroom Sessions:** Habits of Healthy Relationships - The healthy relationships session conducted with first-year students encompassed several crucial aspects for fostering positive social interactions and promoting well-being. Here's a breakdown of the key components and their significance: Understanding Different Types of

Relationships; Recognizing signs of Healthy and Unhealthy Dynamics: Case study and Open Dialogue and Providing Strategies and Tips; Providing Strategies and Tips and Recognizing Red Flags and Seeking support and awareness of resources available on Campus including the UGC – Posh act.

The topic of PDA on campus was important to discuss with students to foster a campus culture where respect and consideration for others are valued and learn to keep a balance with personal expression and sensitivity to other comfort levels and cultural differences.

Overall, the healthy relationships session serves as a foundational step in promoting positive social interactions, emotional intelligence, and personal growth among college students. It equips them with essential skills and knowledge to cultivate meaningful connections and navigate the complexities of human relationships with confidence and empathy.



As part of the Hindi Diwas celebrations following competitions were also held:



### **VOICES IN PROSE**

#### **Of Plutocrats and Paupers - The Great Indian Divide**

An idealist once shared his utopian idea for a film with me. Imagine a day starting with a notification beep that changes your life forever. Your bank account has been credited with big bucks. You think it's a scam but everyone is receiving the same news. A good Samaritan has shared his wealth with lesser mortals like you. Like a bolt from the dark, you realize that you have entered paradise. You take the day off, kick up your feet, loll on your bed and excitedly start making plans on how to utilize this God-sent gift.

It was so tempting to succumb to this shallow socialist theory that carried the belief of resolving all economic and social disparities with this one quixotic egalitarian probability. If the richest shared their wealth with India's 1.48 billion population, sadly, even if it were mathematically feasible, it would do more damage than good.

Think of the surreal repercussions. No one would want to work for another. No one would agree to do blue, red or black collar jobs. Starting from your garbage not being collected, your maid quitting, to offices and industries running short staffed, the world would turn chaotic as almost every person would want to be his own boss. Enter the road to perdition.

Reality, unfortunately, is just as mind boggling or perhaps even more complex and tough to combat, as India knows only too well. How then, do we lessen the vast socio-economic inequality that dogs our nation?

India flags high in the disparity benchmark. Going by the latest statistics, the richest one percent own over 4% of the total wealth created in the country while just 3% has trickled down to the bottom 50% of the population. As per Oxfam India's report of 2023, a mere 5% of Indians own over 60% of the country's wealth, while the bottom 50% of the population possess only 3% of the wealth.

It is therefore a perilous task for the government in

a democratic capitalist society to shrink this imbalance, coupled with inflation and other influencing factors like gender and caste bias. However, measures can be taken to prevent the rich from becoming richer and the poor from getting even more impoverished.

In India, gender bias plays a contributing role in widening the disparity. In many careers and jobs, women receive less than their male counterparts for the same job. For example, in the film industry, the heroine usually takes home a smaller check that the hero. Of course, with growing awareness, this is slowly on the wane. Priyanka Chopra, for instance, recently went on record to say that after so many years in the industry, she finally got a pay check on par with her male co-star.

Another humongous disparity in industries such as Bollywood is the remuneration between the actors, writers and technical crew. While the stars earn in crores, the other contributors to a film receive an embarrassing pittance. Surely the actors could be paid a little less to fill the pockets of the other film workers? This would partially help reduce the economic imbalance in this industry.

A major chasm of socio-economic inequality is the urban-rural see-saw. The village population has limited access to urban social resources such as higher education, health, sanitation and awareness. This stunts their growth and progress though the government has made several efforts in the form of reservations and literacy programmes. Economically, the farmers earn a meagre amount for their crop and effort. The bulk of the money is usurped by wholesale middlemen and the final urban retailers. This in turn puts a heavy burden on the middle and lower classes that constantly struggle with the cost of living crisis and reduced standard of living, thus causing a socio-economic impasse.

Efforts to shrink this vast gap are on, with government aided finance and organisations to

help farmers have more direct access to the markets. However, as a country, we are still dogged by corruption, red tape, financial constraints and impediments that continue to make the journey towards a more balanced socioeconomic India a pothole filled, bumpy ride dotted by scenic visuals of lean and tall bespoke skyscrapers adorning the skyline, looking down on the sea of slums where the majority of the population languishes.

#### Media Representation of the Schedule Castes and Scheduled Tribes

India is one of the largest democracies in the world. In the present world that we live in, mass media has a major role to play in each and every individual life. The technology-driven world has been prioritised to a great extent in helping us communicate and understand issues that need to be focused in today's current scenario. Media is considered as the fourth pillar of the democracy of India. It plays a major part in bringing in certain information that is important to form the humanistic perspective that tries to focus on daily problems of humans. This essay tries to critically analyse the portrayal of media on the issues of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes who have been deliberately used as a tool to serve different agendas.

The origin of the oppressed classes in Indian history can be traced back to the later Vedic age. The Jati system became rigid and the caste system was divided into the Brahmins, Kshatriyas, Vaishyas and Shudras. The Brahmins were considered the highest, with supreme privileges and honours in society. The lowest-occupied positions in society were the Shudras who were considered as the lower ones but there was one more strata in the society called the untouchables they were the ones who were deprived of their basic rights. Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar gave the name schedule caste and the schedule tribe because he was a man who belonged to the same community. He fought hard for their rights as they were struggling to create an impact in society. Mahatma Gandhi used to call them as Harijans.

The media in the post-Independence era, drew attention to the depressed classes to protect their integrity. The Dalit Panthers movement grew. Slowly and steadily, various policies were formed by the government which gave major rights to the scheduled caste and the scheduled tribes. The reservation for the deprived classes came into force in 1937 but over the years it was improved. The right to free education was made compulsory for everyone who belonged to the scheduled caste and the scheduled tribes. Around 4 percent of reservation is still provided to the SC\ST in every field of society to raise their standard of living. Article 21 clearly states that untouchability is criminalised under the law and legal action can be taken against the individuals.

The media is inclined towards sensationalism and victimhood to further broaden issues in the country widely. Media portrayal of SC\ST as a victim so that it challenges the political structure of the country. Today, half of the policies are being made in the name of the SC\ST. The tactics of victim card are being played by the media which emphasises the political arena to fight elections in the name of the SC\ST in the country as it provides an upper hand to them to gain maximum to win elections as well as try to dominate their structure in the society by promising them. Media representation has been problematic but a growing recognition for the need for more inclusive discourses has paved the way for countries' narratives. There are certain emerging platforms that are raising the voices against the stereotypical problems faced by the community to provide them the rights of the deserving people. Supporting and engaging with these media resources is crucial for a wellrounded comprehension for the SC\ST community.

The challenge that the community still poses is that who is accountable for such matters that is working in the current scenario of India. There are certain ethnic values and beliefs that are still contradicting their matter which is being portrayed in a negative manner by the media to catch attention of the public for a bigger picture. Some of the leaders who are quite influential and worked for such things. The voices are not being reached out properly. Media is trying to portray their issues but the zones are going in a different manner. Journalism is not taking ethics as it needs to because there are many places where the communities are not being provided proper sources because of which they are still struggling. Educational barriers created between them due to the lack of information and knowledge not being spreading to them at a larger scale.

India is one of the biggest developing countries in the world. The basic rights to the SC\ST are being provided as the community is growing. According to the 2011 census, 16.8 percent Schedule caste and 8.6 percent Schedule tribes are living in India. Many media channels have portrayed their opinions or views but are the results yielding the proper fruits of it? We need to look at the bigger picture to solve the problem. Many problems are still existing among the deprived classes despite the efforts and policies of the Government and we need to create a country where everyone is considered equal. We need to practise: only then will India be a better place in the near future.
